

Baptismal Form *for Those Professing*

Intro [a]

As we prepare to come into the presence of Almighty God to worship Him, we come as those made clean through the washing which He Himself has provided.

That is why we have gathered to baptize *before* our worship service. In the New Testament, we never find baptism as part of the worship service; this is true to a biblical pattern set from the beginning. Under the old covenant, one was not circumcised or washed in the tabernacle or temple; rather, it was circumcision and then the various washings which qualified God's people to *enter* the tabernacle and temple.

And so it is for us under the new covenant: baptism qualifies us to come into God's presence in worship, as His people.

Therefore, God receives and cleanses this child [*or*: these chosen ones] in baptism today, in order that He might call him [*or*: /her/them] into His presence, as part of His worshipping people.

Intro [b]

Our Lord commanded His Church to disciple the nations, baptizing them into the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.¹ Thus Peter tells us that baptism saves² - not because of the power of the water by which we baptize, but by virtue of the grace of the God who gives Himself to us in baptism.

God the Father gives Himself to us in baptism, including us in His family and marking us out as His children.³

God the Son gives Himself to us in baptism, that we may be united to Him in His death,⁴ sprinkled with His blood for the remission of our sins; and united to Him in His resurrection, being made partakers of His glorious life.⁵

God the Spirit gives Himself to us in baptism, becoming for us the seal and down payment of our inheritance,⁶ assuring us that we have been made heirs of the new heavens and new earth of the age to come, and binding us to our Lord Jesus Christ.

Baptism therefore, is not our work, but the work of God, who gives Himself to us by His gracious covenant.

Yet, as in all covenants there are two parts, so when God gives Himself to us in baptism, He binds us to Himself and obliges us to a new obedience carried out by faith and the power of His Spirit.
